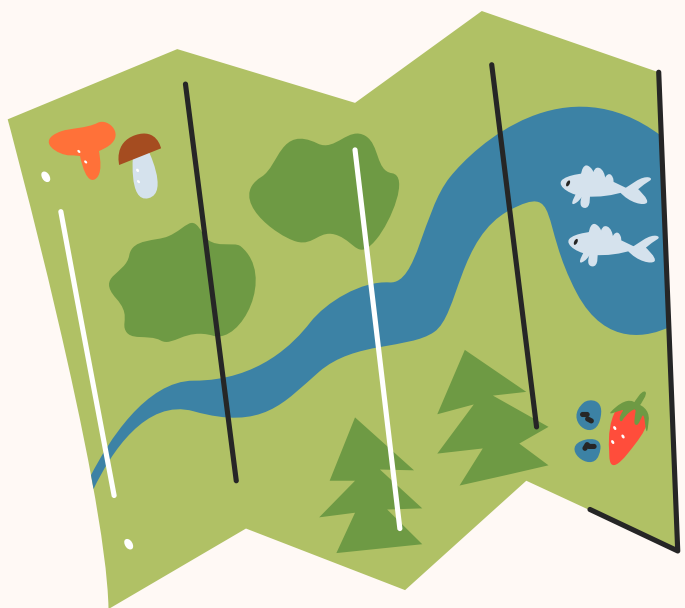




DRY CAMPING TIPS AND INFORMATION

What is dry camping?

Dry camping is when you take your camper somewhere without water or electricity hookups. Typically it involves a generator and fresh water tank reservoir. You must let someone in the office know of your plans to dry camp before departure.



Generator Tips

There are inverter (quiet) generators and loud generators. Always check where you are headed to see if generators are permitted and what quiet hours may be. If you are not renting a generator from White Oak Camper Rentals, please check with the office to ensure your generator will run the unit you have rented.



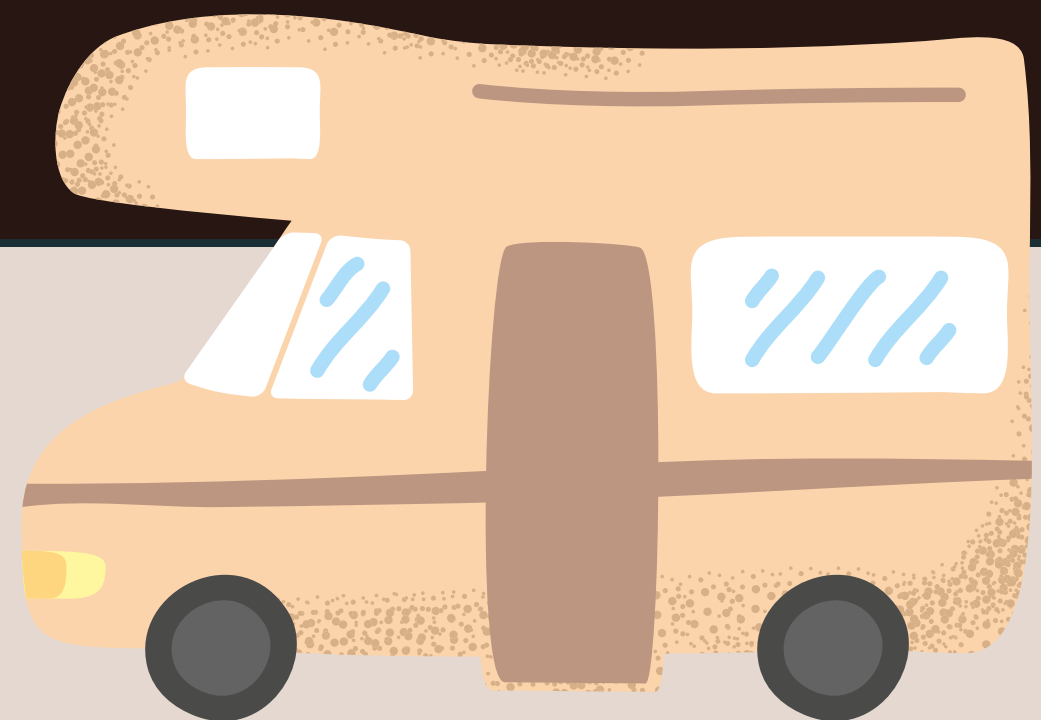
Fresh Water

When dry camping, your camper will have a fresh water reservoir and water pump. Dry camping requires conservation on your part as you have a limited amount of water. We recommend our Disposable Dishes Package filled with plastic and paper dishes to eliminate dish washing in order to save water. You are still responsible for washing dishes during your reservation if you run out of water or an additional cleaning fee will incur. If you are not renting a generator from us, there will be a \$15 charge on your reservation to fill the fresh water tank.



Conserve Water

When showering, keep in mind about 2 gallons of water is coming through the shower head every minute.



50 amp Camper Generators

A 30 amp generator will run a 50 amp camper fully - except it will only run ONE air conditioning unit at a time. Please be mindful of this when choosing your generator at checkout.
